

Youth Leadership Program Selection Criteria

Singing River Electric invites each high school that serves its service territory to **nominate one high school junior** (11th grade) to represent the school in the Youth Leadership Program. Students will participate in a **one-day Cooperative University and be interviewed**. Following this event and the interviews, the out-of-town judges will select students to attend the Youth Leadership Workshop in Jackson and Youth Tour of Washington D.C.

The nominated junior from each high school must:

Have a parent or legal guardian whose main residence is served electricity by Singing
River Electric;
Have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 in general subjects of study or advanced
studies including English, science, history and mathematics;
Be involved in extra-curricular activities sponsored by the school including but not
limited to various clubs, band, athletics, etc.
Be active in civic, community and/or church activities, be an outstanding citizen and
be respected by fellow classmates;
Have a great personality and possess leadership skills;
Have a solid attendance record at school;
Attend SRE's Cooperative University/interview process if named as the school's
nominee for this leadership program;
Attend the two trips if selected as one of SRE's Youth Leadership students:
 Youth Leadership Workshop in Jackson, MS
 Youth Tour of Washington, D.C.

If a student meets these criteria, please have the student contact the school's guidance and/or career center counselor.

The Electric Cooperatives of Mississippi will require all participants to provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test prior to attending both the Youth Leadership Workshop and Youth Tour. Safety requirements are subject to change.
